## Program to focus on museum exhibit

The High Point Historical Society Monthly Guild Series will be 10 a.m. Wednesday at the High Point Museum, 1859 E. Lexington Ave. This program is free and open to the public.

The program will focus on one of the museum's current exhibits — "Celebrating a Century of Commerce," which highlights the 100-year anniversary of the High Point Chamber of Commerce. The speakers for the program will be Sarah Tate, senior director of events and marketing for Business High Point — Chamber of Commerce, and Marian Inabinett, curator of collections for the High Point Museum.

Discussion will focus on the past and

future of Business High Point — Chamber of Commerce.

Tate is a Triad native, a two-time graduate of High Point University with a Bachelor of Arts and Master of Arts in Strategic Communications. She has worked at Business High Point Chamber of Commerce for the past four years. Through her role, she has greatly enjoyed planning for and celebrating the Chamber's 100th anniversary.

Inabinett earned her Bachelor of Arts in English from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill in 1987 and her Master of Arts in Public History from North Carolina State University in 1995. She has worked at the museum since 2012.

## Youth councils eligible for Council for Women & Youth Involvement grants

The North Carolina Department of Administration Council for Women & Youth Involvement is accepting mini grant applications through its State Youth Council program. Youth Councils are active across the state,

enabling students to enhance their communities while helping their peers. The annual mini grant program specifically targets youths, particularly high school students grades nine through 12.

NC Department of Admin-

istration Secretary Machel Sanders said the mini grant program aids in building and improving North Carolina communities while preparing youth for a successful future.

The application is open to youth councils, local gov-

ernment, private and non-profit agencies interested in developing innovative youth programs. Mini grants will range from \$100 to \$500. To be eligible, applications must be received by 5 p.m. Friday, Nov. 1.

The State Youth Councils will screen applications during the Mini-Grant Conference in Rocky Mount on Nov. 15-17. The Youth Advisory Council will also review applications before grants are awarded.
